THE OVERTURE AWARDS

The Overture Awards is a program that recognizes, encourages and rewards excellence in the arts among Tri-state students in grades 9-12. Its mission is to encourage arts education as an integral part of a student's academic experience and to create an environment that encourages training in, and appreciation of, the arts. The Overture Awards Scholarship Competition is the area's largest solo arts competition and offers scholarships in six artistic disciplines: creative writing, dance, instrumental music, vocal music, theater, and visual art. Students may win a \$2,500 scholarship (one awarded in each discipline) or a \$500 finalist scholarship (a total of 18 awarded). Judges at all levels of the competition are drawn from the professional arts community.

The Overture Awards is administrated by the Cincinnati Arts Association (CAA), a not-for-profit organization that oversees the programming and management of two of the Tri-state's finest performing arts venues – the Aronoff Center for the Arts and Music Hall – and is dedicated to supporting performing and visual arts. Each year, CAA presents a diverse schedule of events; serves upwards of 700 thousand people in its venues; features the work of talented local, regional and national artists in the Weston Art Gallery (located in the Aronoff Center); and supports the work of more than one dozen resident companies. Since the inception of its educational programs in 1995, CAA has reached more than 1.2 million people.

WHO MAY APPLY FOR THE COMPETITION

All applications must be submitted through a school, home school, private music teacher or private studio. No individual applications will be accepted.

1. HIGH SCHOOLS:

- All students in grades 9-12 are eligible.
- Schools are encouraged to hold in-school competitions to determine who will compete at the Regional level.
- Schools may send up to 12 students to compete in the Regional Competition and may distribute nominations among the six disciplines as they wish.
- Students may compete in more than one discipline but may enter only once in each (i.e., he or she may apply in dance and theater, but not in tap and ballet).

2. HOME SCHOOLS, VIRTUAL SCHOOLS, PRIVATE STUDIOS/TEACHERS:

- A parent or school coordinator should act as the Overture Coordinator and be responsible for facilitating student registration.
- The qualifications for students nominated by non-traditional schools are the same as for high schools (see above).
- Private studios/teachers should nominate students who have not been nominated by their high school.
- Nontraditional schools may send competitors based upon the number of students enrolled in the school or studio:
 - 1- 25 students: 4 competitors
 - 25-50 students: 8 competitors
 - 50 or more students: 12 competitors

3. PRIOR FINALISTS:

- All prior Overture Awards finalists still in high school are automatically entitled to compete in future Overture Awards competitions. They must pay the entry fee, however.
- Prior finalists will not be counted toward the total number of competitors for their school.

REGISTERING STUDENTS TO COMPETE

1. COORDINATORS:

Please fill in the Coordinator Form. If you are a returning coordinator, be sure to complete **all** of the information on the form, even if nothing has changed since last year. A home school parent should serve as his or her student's coordinator. All Overture Competition forms can be found on the Overture Awards website: www.cincinnatiarts.org/overture_competition. We highly recommend using these fillable forms. Typed material is easier to read and makes our database more accurate. The forms cannot be submitted online, however.

2. APPLICATION FEE:

- There is a **\$20 non-refundable entrance fee** to compete. The entrance fee allows a student to compete in more than one discipline.
- Schools, PTAs or other organizations may pay entrance fees for their students.
- Checks, credit cards and school purchase orders are accepted. Make checks payable to the "Cincinnati Arts Association - Overture Awards." Call 513-977-4168 to make a credit card payment.
- Students with an economic hardship may have their entrance fee waived at the discretion of the school's coordinator.

3. FORMS:

- **DEADLINE:** All necessary information must be to the Cincinnati Arts Association by **5:00 p.m. on Monday, November 14, 2011.**
- All of the following forms must arrive in one package. If any are not received (and correctly completed) by the deadline, the student(s) will be disqualified:
 - Overture Coordinator Form
 - Participant List
 - Student Applications
 - Creative Writing Manuscript Submission (4 copies of each)
 - Fees
 - Music if using an Overture Awards Accompanist

- Hand Delivery: Those Coordinators wishing to hand deliver their application packet may do so during office hours at the CAA's administrative offices located on Seventh Street between Walnut and Main Streets. After hours deliveries should go to the Stage Door Security Desk a few doors down from the main entrance.

REGIONAL COMPETITION – JANUARY 7, 2012

- Students will be notified in mid-December of their competition time and location.
- If a competitor has not received notification by December 30, 2011 he or she should call or e-mail the Cincinnati Arts Association at (513) 977-4168 or overtures@CincinnatiArts.ORG.
- Students or coordinators must submit written notice of any possible time conflicts with their application. **Once competition times have been assigned they cannot be changed.**
- Competitors **must** notify the Cincinnati Arts Association of cancellations by December 30 at 513-977-4168 or overtures@cincinnatiarts.org. Failure to appear without prior notification will result in your school losing one of its twelve places and the student not being allowed to compete in next year's competition.
- The Regional Competitions are closed auditions; visitor waiting areas are available at each site. No parents, teachers or coaches will be allowed in the competition area.
- Approximately 20 percent of students in each discipline competing at the Regionals will be selected to compete at the Semi-Finals.
- **Accompanists** – Students may use their own accompanist. If a student needs an accompanist, the Overture Awards will provide one. An accompanist request and music must accompany the application.

SEMI-FINAL COMPETITION – JANUARY 21, 2012

- Semi-Finalists will be posted on our website (www.CincinnatiArts.ORG/overture_awards) by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 9, 2012.
- This part of the Competition takes place at the Aronoff Center for the Arts.
- The Semi-Finals are open auditions and free to the public (with limited seating on a first-come, first-served basis). Creative Writing and Visual Art judging will not be open to the public.

FINALS COMPETITION – MARCH 3, 2012

- All Finalists will be notified the week after the Semi-Final Competition by mail. Results will also appear on our website (www.CincinnatiArts.ORG/overture_awards) by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 23, 2012.
- Finalists must attend a dress rehearsal and the Finals Competition/Awards Ceremony in order to be eligible for a scholarship. This applies to students in all six disciplines.
- The Finals Competition is open to the public. All tickets are \$15 each.

CREATIVE WRITING CRITERIA

CATEGORIES: Fiction, Creative Non-Fiction, Poetry, Play and Screenplay

1. All criteria set forth in these pages apply to the Regional, Semi-Final and Final Competitions, unless otherwise noted.
2. Competitors will primarily be judged on, but not limited to, the following:
 - Overall strength of submission
 - Creativity and artistry
 - Form, structure, plot
 - Grammar, spelling
 - Use of language
3. The following requirements, if not met, can result in a student having points deducted from his or her submission or, in some cases, disqualification. Please read carefully.
 - 5-20 PAGES OF WORK ARE REQUIRED. If submitting a section of a longer piece, include a one page synopsis.
 - Submissions MUST be cleanly typed, single-sided, on 8 ½" x 11" sheets of paper.
 - Pages MUST be numbered.
 - Submit **four** (4) copies of the manuscript. Three should be stapled, the other clipped together.
 - Students MUST include a **cover sheet** with each copy with name, school and category of submission (poetry, fiction, etc.).
 - Submissions will NOT be returned.
4. Submissions MUST accompany the application form and be included in the same packet with your school's other entries. No late or separate submissions will be accepted.
5. STUDENTS MAY SUBMIT WORK IN ONLY ONE CATEGORY.
 - FICTION: Submit one short story or a novel excerpt (with one page synopsis)
 - CREATIVE NON-FICTION: Essay may not be a research paper. It may be opinion/editorial, biography, in-depth/feature story or personal essay
 - PLAYS/SCREENPLAYS: Monologue, one act or excerpt (with one page synopsis)
 - POETRY: Submit 5-10 poems
6. **Semi-Finalists and Finalists** will be notified by mail of their advancement in the Competition. No further action is required, as the CAA will forward their submissions on to the Semi-Final and Final judges. Results will also appear on our website, www.CincinnatiArts.ORG/overture_awards.
7. **Finalists** must attend the Finals Competition rehearsal (refer to timeline), and be prepared to read an artist's statement or a piece of writing summarizing their work and vision. Finalists must also attend the Finals Competition/Awards Ceremony in order to be eligible for a scholarship.

DANCE CRITERIA

CATEGORIES: Ballet, Modern, Lyrical, Jazz, Tap, and Folk/Ethnic

1. All criteria set forth below apply to the Regional, Semi-Final and Final Competitions except where otherwise noted.
2. Students should perform their best work. Do not choose works that are more difficult than your current level of proficiency to impress the judges.
3. No parents, teachers or coaches will be allowed in the competition area.
4. Open to SOLOISTS ONLY.
5. Students may perform in any style of dance. A competitor may choose to do more than one selection in his or her selected style.
6. Performances will be primarily judged on, but not limited to, the following:
 - Overall skill and technical level
 - Creativity
 - Artistic Expression and potential
 - Mastery of Choreography
 - Coordination
 - Musicality
 - Stage presence
7. Performances must be **more than 1.5 minutes but less than 4 minutes** total.
8. For the Regional round, competitors *will be stopped* at 4 minutes. For the Semi-Final and Final Competitions, competitors *will not be stopped*. However, time is kept and the judges will deduct points from the competitors score for overruns.
9. Competitors need not perform the same piece(s) they perform at the Regionals if they advance to the Semi-Final and Final Competitions.
10. Students must bring their own CD (no cassettes, records or mini disks, please.) The piece(s) must be cued. CD players will be provided. It is recommended that you bring a backup CD.
11. COSTUMES: For the Regional and Semi-Final Competitions, costumes are optional. For the Finals Competition, costumes are **required**. Attire must be appropriate for the selection.
12. Essential props are permitted if they are an integral part of the dance.
13. CHOREOGRAPHY: do not choreograph your piece yourself!
14. Dancers are responsible for warm-up before their auditions. Warm-up space is provided. For the Semi-Final and Final Competitions, students will be allowed to walk the dance competition area prior to their performance.
15. Rosin will be provided.
16. Marley floors will be provided.

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC CRITERIA

CATEGORIES: Any instrument is accepted.

1. All criteria set forth here apply to the Regional, Semi-Final and Final Competitions, unless otherwise noted.
2. Students should perform their best work and not choose pieces that are more difficult than their current level of proficiency to impress the judges.
3. No parents, teachers or coaches will be allowed in the competition area.
4. Open to SOLOISTS ONLY. Ensembles are not permitted.
5. Performances will be judged on over-all artistic excellence as demonstrated by:
 - Intonation
 - Tone quality
 - Technique: articulation, bowing, tonguing, fingering, fluency, embouchure, pedaling
 - Level of technical difficulty
 - Rhythmic accuracy
 - Interpretation and artistic expression
 - General musicianship – expression dynamics, tempo, phrasing
 - Memorization
 - Stage presentation
6. Students may choose one or more pieces to perform within the time limit. **MUSIC MUST BE MEMORIZED.** If it is not, this will result in immediate disqualification.
7. Performances must be **no less than 1.5 minutes** and **no more than 5 minutes** total. In order to adhere to time limits, appropriate cuts in the music are acceptable.
8. For the Regional Competition, competitors *will be stopped* at 5 minutes. For the Semi-Final and Final Competitions, competitors *will not be stopped*. However, time is being kept and the judges will deduct points from the competitor's score for overruns.
9. Competitors need not perform the same piece(s) they performed in the Regional round if they advance to the Semi-Final and Final Competitions.
10. Competitors must be accompanied by piano (except for piano, percussion instrument, guitar or if playing a piece that written as unaccompanied). **Students may use their own accompanist for all rounds of the competition. If you do not have an accompanist, the Overture Awards will supply one for you. You must indicate your need on your application and enclose a copy of your music clearly marked for the accompanist.**
11. Competitors must supply their own instruments at the Competition (except piano).
12. Five (5) COPIES of the music being performed with the measures clearly numbered and marked and the student's name on each copy must be furnished for the judges on the day of the competition. **NO COPYING SERVICE IS AVAILABLE AT COMPETITION SITES. COMPETITORS MUST SUPPLY THEIR OWN COPIES AND HAVE THEM PRIOR TO ARRIVING AT THE COMPETITION.**

THEATER CRITERIA

CATEGORIES: Drama and Musical Theater

1. All criteria set forth on this page apply to the Regional, Semi-Final and Final Competitions unless otherwise noted.
2. Students should perform their best work and not choose works that are more difficult than their current level of proficiency to impress the judges.
3. You must select characters ***of an age that you can realistically portray.***
4. No parents, teachers or coaches will be allowed in the competition area.
5. Performances will be primarily judged on, but not limited to, the following:
 - Individual talent, skill and potential
 - Stage presence
 - Projection
 - Articulation/Pronunciation
 - Interpretation and understanding of text, artistic expression
 - Physical movements and gestures
6. Prepared pieces must run **no less than 1.5 minutes** but **no more than 5 minutes** total and be performed one right after another with only a brief pause between.
7. For the Regional Competition, competitors *will be stopped* at 5 minutes. At the Semi-Final and Final Competitions, competitors *will not be stopped*. However, time is being kept and the judges will deduct overruns from the competitor's score.
8. Competitors need not perform the same piece(s) they perform at Regionals if they advance to the Semi-Final and Final Competitions.
9. A chair and one table will be provided for use. Simple hand props are permitted if they are an integral part of the scene. They must be provided by the competitor.
10. **COSTUMES:** Costumes are optional. Blacks are appropriate at the Regional and Semi-Final Competitions. Audition apparel should enhance the work performed.
11. **DRAMA CATEGORY** (*does not apply to Musical Theater*): Competitor's two selections must consist of **one contemporary (20th and 21st century)** and **one classical (pre-1900)** monologue.
12. **MUSICAL THEATER CATEGORY** (*does not apply to Drama*):
 - Competitor's two selections will consist of one classical (pre-1900) monologue and one song from the musical theater repertoire.
 - Competitors must be accompanied by piano. **Students may use their own accompanist for all rounds of the competition. If you do not have an accompanist, the Overture Awards will supply one for you if you indicate your need on your application and enclose a copy of your music.**
 - In order to adhere to time limits, appropriate cuts in the song are acceptable and should be marked on the accompanist's copy if you are using an Overture Awards accompanist.
 - Dancing will not be adjudicated. Blocking of your musical number, although not required, is strongly encouraged.

VISUAL ART CRITERIA

CATEGORIES: Painting, drawing, printmaking, sculpture, textile design, jewelry, creative woodwork, pottery, graphic design, photography, video.

CHOOSING YOUR WORK

A portfolio is a collection of your best and most recent artwork that highlights your art experience. No matter how long you have been creating work, if you have a collection of your own art, then you have enough for a portfolio.

Allow plenty of time to choose the work for your portfolio or to create it. It is very difficult to produce good art when you are under pressure. This should be a thoughtful process. The judges are looking for an artistic statement expressed by your entire body of work, which means to go beyond the basic classroom assignments.

The Overture Awards requires **at least six but not more than eight pieces of your own work**. These need not all be in the same medium. Work copied from another artist's work or photographs is not permitted.

Competitors will be primarily judged on, but not limited to, the following:

- Command of medium
- Originality/creativity
- Technique: use of color, texture, perspective
- Composition

PORTFOLIO PREPARATION

Presentation of your portfolio is important! Be sure to make your submission as professional as possible. The following criteria apply to the Regional, Semi-Final and Final Competitions unless otherwise noted:

- Deliver your work in a case that will adequately protect the work. Cardboard cases are available at a small cost from local art stores. **YOU MUST** label it **on the outside** with your name and the name of your school.
- Include with your portfolio a cover sheet (**required**) with the title, size, medium and a brief description of each piece. If the work was created or modified on a computer, please state this in your description. You can download a copy of the cover sheet from the Overture Awards website (www.cincinnatiarts.org/overture_competition) or get one from your Coordinator. Put this into your portfolio case loose; do not attach it to anything.
- The size limit for all pieces is 30" x 40", not including mat.
- 2-D artwork, except for stretched canvases, must be matted (preferably white or off-white), **not framed**. Be sure the mat is clean and unbent. Do not tape separation sheets to mats.
- Label all work **on the back** (putting a name on the front detracts the viewer's eye from the piece itself) with your name, school and the corresponding cover sheet number.
- Label the top of each piece on the back so that it will be viewed correctly.

- For the Regional Competition, work that is unavailable due to another competition or exhibition may also be submitted as photographs on a CD in .jpg, .tiff, or .gif format. Provide more than one view. Photos must be marked with a corresponding number on the cover sheet and clearly marked as a photograph of artwork and not a photographic submission.
- Video submissions:
 - Time limit: 1.5 to 5 minutes in length
 - If the piece is longer, select 5 minutes of it and include a one-page synopsis that states where the segment occurs.
 - Must be in DVD format.
- 3-D work:
 - For the Regional Competition, 3-D work should be submitted as photographs on a CD in .jpg, .tiff, or .gif format. Provide more than one view. Photos must be marked with a corresponding number on the cover sheet and clearly marked as a photograph of artwork and not a photographic submission.
 - **For the Semi-Final and Final Competitions, you must submit your original work.**

VOCAL MUSIC CRITERIA

CATEGORIES: All vocal styles are accepted

1. All criteria set forth in these pages apply to the Regional, Semi-Finals and Finals, unless otherwise noted.
2. Students should perform their best work. Do not choose works that are more difficult than your current level of proficiency to impress the judges.
3. No parents, teachers or coaches will be allowed in the competition area.
4. Open to SOLOISTS ONLY.
5. Performances will be judged primarily on, but not limited to, the following:
 - Quality of Tone
 - Technique -- ease of production, breath support, intonation, flexibility, legato
 - Communication/Interpretation/Diction -- the degree and clarity, i.e., effectiveness of communication the music's text and mood
 - Musicianship -- dynamics, tempo, rhythm, phrasing, style
 - Stage Presence -- appearance, posture, charisma, preparation, memorization
 - Expression -- demonstrating an individual musical personality
6. Performances at the Regional Round must run **no less than 1.5 minutes** but **no more than 3 minutes** total. For the Semi-Finals and Finals Competition, students will have up to **5** minutes to perform.
7. **For the Regional competition, competitors will be stopped at 3 minutes.** For the Semi-Finals and Finals Competition, competitors *will not be stopped*. However, time is being kept and the judges will deduct points from the competitor's score for overruns.
8. Competitors need not perform the same piece(s) they perform at Regionals if they advance to the Semi-Finals and Finals Competitions.
9. **Regional Competition: Each contestant will sing only one selection.** Students should choose their strongest material to perform. **THE PIECE MUST BE MEMORIZED.**
10. **Semi-Finals and Finals Competition:** Each contestant must prepare two musical selections. It is strongly recommended that the selections be contrasting in mood, character, style and tempo. **THE MUSIC MUST BE MEMORIZED.**
11. Competitors must be accompanied by piano. Students may use their own accompanist for all rounds of the competition. If you do not have an accompanist and need one, the Overture Awards will supply one for you. You must indicate your need on your application and enclose a copy of your music clearly marked for the accompanist with your application.
12. In order to adhere to time limits, appropriate cuts in the song are acceptable.
