The Overture Awards

The Cincinnati Arts Association's Overture Awards recognizes, encourages, and rewards excellence in the arts among Tri-state students in grades 9-12. Its mission is to encourage arts education as an integral part of a student's academic experience and to create an environment that encourages training in, and appreciation of, the arts. The Overture Awards Competition is the area's largest solo arts competition and offers awards in six artistic disciplines: creative writing, dance, instrumental music, theater, visual art, and vocal music. For the 2021 competition, students will win \$2,000 (one awarded in each discipline) or a \$750.00 finalist award (a total of 18 awarded). Judges at all levels of the competition are drawn from the professional arts community.
